MFL

Maths

Let's get calculating , as we meet our final 2 operations this term looking at formal multiplication and division. We will keep pushing hard on out=r times tables starting with the 7s and 8s.

A huge chuck of this term looks at finding equivalent fractions and playing with fractions and mixed numbers and improper fractions, multiplying, adding and subtracting fractions to solve puzzles.

Finally, we will be looking at decimals and percentages and how they relate to fractions.


Computing
