The National Deaf Children's Society (NDCS) is a charity that has lots of information to help Deaf children in the UK.

78% of deaf children are in mainstream schools and may be the only deaf person in their school



There are more than 50,000 Deaf children in the UK

More than 200 D/deaf children live in Warrington


The NDCS


#### What did you say? Island view or I love you?



It takes more effort to listen hard




## **Different levels of Deafness**





#### What can we hear?



The volume of sounds we hear is measured in decibels (dB).

- Mild (21-40 dB)
- Moderate (41-70 dB)
- Severe (71-89 dB)
- Profound (90dB +)
