


Writing




Have you ever thought about where your rubbish goes after you put it in the bin? Over the first half term, we will be exploring the story of the Paper Bag Prince, which looks at the effects of landfills on our earth. We will be writing to persuade, using emotive language, to convince others to save our earth.

Continuing with our environmental theme, we will be travelling to Africa and going on a journey of self discovery with Jamina and a wild elephant. We will be learning to write our own adventure stories from the point of view of an endangered animal.

And what about our vicious Vikings? We will be exploring their arrival at Lindisfarne. We will be stepping into the shoes of the Vikings (or the monks) and exploring how it felt during the raid.

Continuing our theme on Vikings, we will be looking at Old Norse poetry involving Kennings. In the style of Vikings, we will writing our own poetry together.


Science –Living Things



As we begin to look at life around us this term, we look back on our previous learning to do with plants. We explore how they grow, pollinate and how they make new plants. We look at the life cycle of plants and compare this to other life cycles including the beautiful butterfly which undergoes amazing change!


After half term our work continues to investigate the world around us and how we grow and change through life. We look at miles stones in our life cycle which links to our PSHE Living and Growing at the end of the summer term.

Music



Throughout the term through our Sing Up Music programme, we will be studying a range of musical themes such as interlocking rhythms, vocal chants, musical cycles. ternary form/ABA, pentatonic scales, tempo, dynamics, 20th-century orchestral music. melody, four-part singing in a round and creating an arrangement.


PSHE



This term in PSHE we will be focusing on positive, healthy relationships. How do we communicate effectively? How do we resolve conflicts? What is a healthy relationship? During the second half of the term we will be looking at the ‘growing and changing’ unit. As we move towards the end of Year 5, we will think about the achievements and aspirations we have for the future. Some of us may have conflicting emotions so we will be talking about how to manage those feelings and how to deal with change. Puberty will be covered, talking about the physical and emotional changes you will go through as you move towards being a teenager.

Finally, we will investigate healthy lifestyles, balancing our choices of food to improve our wellbeing and health. Developing good habits to keep ourselves healthy will be an area we discuss and comparing the images we see in the media compared with our real lives.

Year 5 Summer Term

Topic—The Amazon Rainforest (Geography) and The Vikings (History)

In the first half term, we journey back to Brazil to look at the rainforests in our Geography topic. We learn to compare the climate of Brazil and our own climate and learn to represent these results in a graph and discuss findings. We explain the different layers of the rainforest and look at the animals we may find in this environment. Finally we look at the impact deforestation on the rainforest environment.

Vicious or Victorious? Were the Vikings really as bad as everybody says? This term we will be investigating how Vikings came to Britain and the legacy they have left us today. Where and when did they invade?


To begin this topic, we bring the Vikings to life as we become Vikings for a day. Dressed in clothes for the time, we explore some of the skills, food and crafts of Viking times. We look at the fantastic long ships and create our own piece of Viking jewellery.

You will step into the shoes of Viking raider as you relive the events of Lindisfarne, writing first-hand accounts from different perspectives.

Who will you pray to when in danger? Looking back at our learning in religion of the Anglo-Saxons , how do the Vikings compare?

We will look at what life is really like for a Viking in Britain. What would you have been doing if you were a ten year old Viking?




During the first half term, we will take part in cricket lessons which will be led by a visiting cricket coach. We will also be learning to play golf which will be a new sport for us — we can’t wait!

We will be using these skills to develop a cross curricular piece of work linked to ourselves as individuals and how we grow and change.

Grammar




Our grammar focuses on all our topics this term. We will be reviewing everything we have covered so far this year, as well as looking at the use of the passive voice in our writing

We will be exploring how and when to use all the different punctuation to make our writing clear to read for all.

Don’t forget conjunctions. Can you explain ISAWAWABUB and FANBOYS? Try using these in a variety of ways in our writing to link ideas together.


This term we really get to shine as we explain the difference between clauses and phrases, we look at relative pronouns, adverbs, modal verbs and exclamations. How about that! Show what you really know.

MFL



During the half term, we will be working together to improve our speaking & listening skills throughout the topic ‘How I am feeling.’ We shall work together to learn the difference between phrases such as J’ai très mal et J’ai suis tranquille. Lots of role play fun & quizzes.

To start with , we will be designing and creating mobile phone holders which will be carried on from last term’s topic. We will then pose the question , ‘What do you think makes a frame or structure strong?’

Spelling




This term is all about accuracy! We will be looking at lots of different pieces of writing and finding the spelling mistakes, correcting them and thinking carefully about the rules we need to apply.

We will be revising all that we have learned as well as revisiting challenge words from the Year 5 and 6 list.

We will be looking at different ways to explore words through investigation, drawing and using dictionaries to find out all it meanings .

Finally, we will be looking at homophones and near homophones and applying the correct form in our writing.

Using our RE scheme, we will be asking the question, ‘How do people decide what to believe?’ The children will look at who influences them in their own lives, looking at different sources of authority and then linking this to what Christians believe & the concept of trinity.

Later in the term, we shall ask the question ‘Do people need laws to guide them?’
